Exploring the magic of everyday waste

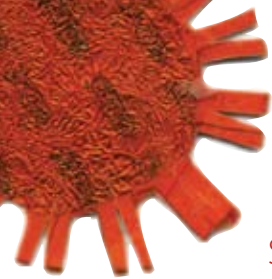


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Themes include:

Sessions use accessible techniques to create magical pieces from everyday waste materials.

Jewels of India

Create a collaborative wall-hanging embellished with sequins, foils and trimmings, inspired by beautiful Indian fabrics.



Old Macdonald had a Farm

A family learning special, this course for adults looks at creating sensory educational wall hangings of animals, sounds, weather, numbers and seasons.



Funky Flip-Flops

Bring summer to your feet and create a pair of fabulous, funky flip flops out of discarded and recycled materials.



Contemporary Jewellery

A very inspired course, creating jewellery for fashion using an exciting diversity of household waste materials.



Egyptian Gold

Create opal, turquoise and gold collars and discover the symbolic significance of scarab beetles, good luck charms and colour in Ancient Egypt.



Hungry Caterpillars

Another popular course using fridge magnets, a sensory caterpillar, puzzles and sequential pictures that improve a child's learning.

Sketchbook Special

Learn to draw combining traditional media with recycled collage for illustration and natural history projects. Create stories and develop words and pictures.



Africa Adorned

The theme takes inspiration from the Masai tribe in Kenya. Exploring a variety of materials, colours and patterns, participants are encouraged to create adornments or wall hangings.



Hickory Dickory Dock

Create a simple clock and mouse to inspire a child to tell the time, making it a fun way of learning rhythm and rhyme.
